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# 1. General information

This manual is a supplementary document for the 'Digital Locking Cylinder and Digital Half Cylinder 3061 – TN4' manual. The aforementioned document describes the installation, operation and battery replacement for the TN4 cylinder generation, which is also used for the DoorMonitoring (DM) cylinder. The safety instructions are also listed in the document, which are also valid for the DM Cylinder.

This particular document describes the DM Cylinder's functions. When the basic functions are used, the DM Cylinder behaves in exactly the same way as a SimonsVoss digital locking cylinder. For this reason, this product description only deals with the special features of the DM Cylinder. Reference is made to the product manual for Digital Locking and Half Cylinder 3061 – TN4, its installation and handling.

# 1.1 Description

Door Monitoring Cylinder 3061 [DM Cylinder] is an electronic locking cylinder with integrated door monitoring. The integrated door monitoring system in the DM Cylinder is fitted without any wiring to the door.

Sensors within the DM Cylinder monitor the rotation of the cam. Sensors in the intelligent fastening screw monitor the door's opening status.

The DoorMonitoring Cylinder [DM] logs access events (access lists) and monitors door status and changes to door status (open, closed, locked, securely locked, manipulation attempt and forced entry).

The following door statuses are logged:

- Door open or closed
- Cam rotated once/twice (maximum four times) door unlocked / locked / securely locked
- 🖬 Alarm

These door statuses can be transmitted via the network and to the software, where they can be displayed, so that the user can see the transmitted status easily.

The software allows you to define events which trigger a definable, timedependent response, such as an email or a pop-up window with a warning, when the status of a locking device changes.

All changes are logged in the access list, including the transponder ID, date and time, which the locking system operator or a security officer can then upload and evaluate if necessary.

# 1.2 Specifications



# NOTE

DM cylinders must not be used in multi-lock systems with gears (gear locking devices).

DM.AP2 cylinders without bolt monitoring are an exception and can also be used in multi-lock systems with gears.

### Standard design

The DM Cylinder is supplied in the following standard configuration:

- .DM DoorMonitoring
- I.G2 available as G2 only
- .ZK access control, time zone management and events logging

The following accessories must be ordered with the standard configuration:

Z4.DM.dd.SCREW.n Fastening Screw



### NOTE

You must indicate the backset when ordering the fastening screw

The fastening screw is manufactured to match the backset and is a few millimetres longer

Information is only correctly transferred to the cylinder if the fastening screw is the right length.

dd represents the lock's backset. Standard fastening screws are supplied for backsets between 25 and 110 mm at increments of 5 mm. Greater lengths are possible at increments of 5 mm.

# Options

The following options are available for the DM Cylinder:

- .FD freely rotating
- AP2 anti-panic cylinder (no monitoring in the bolt position)
- III .HZ half cylinder
- **I**.FH fire retardant version (increased transmission range)
- .WN(M).LN.I Integrated LockNode, with or without auto-configuration

### Installation lengths

The DM Cylinder is supplied at 30-35mm and larger (outside – inside).

#### Order codes

Refer to the respective current price list or the current product catalogue for the corresponding product codes.

# 2. Intended use

Digital SimonsVoss SI-Locking Cylinder are installed in designated door locks, such as DIN mortise locks, to integrate them into a digital locking system.

The digital SI-Locking Cylinder may only be used for its intended purpose in a designated door locking device. No other use is permitted.

Digital SI-Locking Cylinders are available in various lengths. The selection of the proper size is of significance. The length of the locking cylinder is printed on the packaging and can be measured at any time. If the cylinder is too short, the handles cannot be fitted. If the cylinder is too long, it may be ripped out of the locking device. The may not protrude more than 3 mm on each side of the door to ensure proper operation.

The product may not be changed in any way, other than in compliance with the changes described in the instructions.

# 3. General safety instructions

# Blocked access

Access through a door may stay blocked due to incorrectly fitted and/or incorrectly programmed components. SimonsVoss Technologies GmbH is not liable for the consequences of blocked access such as access to injured or endangered persons, material damage or other damage!

# Blocked access through manipulation of the product

If you change the product on your own, malfunctions can occur and access through a door can be blocked.

Modify the product only when needed and only in the manner described in the documentation.

## Do not swallow battery. Danger of burns from hazardous substances

This product contains lithium button cell batteries. Swallowing the button cell battery, in can result in severe internal burns leading to death in as little as two hours.

- 1. Keep new and used batteries away from children.
- 2. If the battery compartment does not close securely, cease using the product and keep it away from children.
- 3. If you think batteries have been swallowed or are in any part of the body, seek medical attention immediately.

### Risk of explosion due to incorrect battery type

Inserting the wrong type of battery can cause an explosion.

• Only use the batteries specified in the technical data.



# CAUTION

### Fire hazard posed by batteries

The batteries used may pose a fire or burn hazard if handled incorrectly.

- 1. Do not try to charge, open, heat or burn the batteries.
- 2. Do not short-circuit the batteries.

### IMPORTANT

#### Damage resulting from electrostatic discharge (ESD) when enclosure is open

This product contains electronic components that may be damaged by electrostatic discharges.

- 1. Use ESD-compliant working materials (e.g. Grounding strap).
- 2. Ground yourself before carrying out any work that could bring you into contact with the electronics. For this purpose, touch earthed metallic surfaces (e.g. door frames, water pipes or heating valves).

#### Damage resulting from liquids

This product contains electronic and/or mechanic components that may be damaged by liquids of any kind.

**#** Keep liquids away from the electronics.

#### Damage resulting from aggressive cleaning agents

The surface of this product may be damaged as a result of the use of unsuitable cleaning agents.

Only use cleaning agents that are suitable for plastic or metal surfaces.

#### Damage as a result of mechanical impact

This product contains electronic components that may be damaged by mechanical impacts of any kind.

- 1. Avoid touching the electronics.
- 2. Avoid other mechanical influences on the electronics.

### Damage due to polarity reversal

This product contains electronic components that may be damaged by reverse polarity of the power source.

Do not reverse the polarity of the voltage source (batteries or mains adapters).

### Operational malfunction due to radio interference

This product may be affected by electromagnetic or magnetic interference.

Do not mount or place the product directly next to devices that could cause electromagnetic or magnetic interference (switching power supplies!).

#### Communication interference due to metallic surfaces

This product communicates wirelessly. Metallic surfaces can greatly reduce the range of the product.

Do not mount or place the product on or near metallic surfaces.

### Intended use

SmartIntego-products are designed exclusively for opening and closing doors and similar objects.

Do not use SmartIntego products for any other purposes.

# Malfunctions due to poor contact or different discharge

Contact surfaces that are too small/contaminated or different discharged batteries can lead to malfunctions.

- 1. Only use batteries that are approved by SimonsVoss.
- 2. Do not touch the contacts of the new batteries with your hands.
- 3. Use clean and grease-free gloves.
- 4. Always replace all batteries at the same time.

# Different times for G2 locks

The internal time unit of the G2 locks has a technical tolerance of up to  $\pm$  15 minutes per year.

**E** Regularly reprogram time-critical locking devices.

# Qualifications required

Installation and initial operation require specialist knowledge.

• Only trained specialist personnel may install and put the product into operation.

# Incorrect installation

SimonsVoss Technologies GmbH accepts no liability for damage caused to doors or components due to incorrect fitting or installation.

Modifications or further technical developments cannot be excluded and may be implemented without notice.

The German language version is the original instruction manual. Other languages (drafting in the contract language) are translations of the original instructions.

Read and follow all installation, installation, and commissioning instructions. Pass these instructions and any maintenance instructions to the user.

# 4. Product specific safety notices



# WARNING

### Escape door function malfunction

The use of unsuitable components or ones that are not ready for operation can impair the function of an escape door. If you use the anti-panic cylinder in non-approved locks, the escape door function may be impaired and cannot be released again.

- 1. Make sure that all parts of the lock are ready for operation.
- 2. Make sure that the panic function of the mortise lock is ensured.
- 3. Please refer to the documentation of the lock manufacturer.
- 4. Use the anti-panic cylinder within the specified temperature range.
- 5. Perform a function test after installing the anti-panic cylinder or changing its battery.



# CAUTION

# Use of the anti-panic version of the locking cylinder in non-approved locks

If you use the anti-panic version of the locking cylinder in unauthorised locks, the escape door function may be impaired and cannot be released again.

- 1. Only use the anti-panic version of the locking cylinder in locks for which the locking cylinder is expressly approved.
- 2. Please refer to the documentation of the respective lock manufacturer.
- 3. Contact SimonsVoss Technologies GmbH for further information on this subject (see *Help and other information* [▶ 88]).

### Hand injuries from carrier springing back

A spring-loaded carrier is used in the anti-panic construction of the closing cylinder. This carrier can spring back when it is not installed, causing hand injuries.

Do not hold the anti-panic construction of the closing cylinders in the area of the carrier.

# IMPORTANT

### Damage caused by moisture in outdoor use

Moisture can damage the electronics.

- 1. If you want to use the locking cylinder for outdoor applications or in high humidity (bathrooms or washrooms), use the WP version.
- 2. Carefully insert the locking cylinder to avoid damaging the O-rings.

### Mechanical damage to the thumb turn as a result of obstacles

If the thumb turn can knock against the wall or other objects as a result of the installation situation, it may become damaged.

In such situations, use a suitable door stop.

### Mechanical damage to the thumb turn through misuse as door-opener

Some doors are very heavy and solidly constructed. The thumb turn is not suitable for opening such doors.

- 1. Don't pull the thumb turn to open doors.
- 2. Make suitable door openers available (suitable handles) to avoid misuse of the thumb turn.

#### DoorMonitoring in gear locks

Door monitoring cylinders are not suitable for operation in multi-lock systems with gear (gear locking devices). Except: DM.AP2, without bolt monitoring.

Do not use door monitoring cylinders in gear locking devices.



### NOTE

# Maintenance interval of not more than one month for emergency exit locks

As per European standard EN 179, Appendix C, all components in a locking device must be checked at intervals no greater than one month to ensure that they are in satisfactory working order as part of emergency exit locking device maintenance.

### Locking up of persons without means of identification

The freely-rotating construction of the closing cylinder can only be opened with a means of identification from both sides.

Ensure that no persons without means of identification are in the secured area.

### Length of locking system password

For security reasons, the locking system password must consist of at least 8 characters. The code length for digital closing cylinders *(and for System 3060/3061 and MobileKey)* corresponds to 2<sup>168</sup> Bit.

### Fault in the interior knob due to moisture

The inner knob of the closing cylinder is of protection class IP40 and is thus not protected from moisture.

Ensure that the interior knob cannot come into contact with water.

Battery changes may only be carried out by trained personnel and only with the intended battery key (Z4.SCHLUESSEL)!

# Programming with obsolete LSM version

New components can only be programmed with the current version of LSM.

### Difficulty of operation of the lock due to stiff latch or bolt

If the latch or bolt of the mortice lock are stiff, the closing cylinder will also be stiff.

Check that the latch or the bolt of the mortice lock are free-moving.

### Fitting error or incorrect order

If you make a mistake in measuring the door and order a closing cylinder, the closing cylinder will not fit.

Check the dimensions of the door again before ordering.

# 5. Initial operation

Refer to the 'Digital Locking Cylinder and Half Cylinder – TN4' product manual for general installation instructions. The manual describes how the different cylinder versions are fitted.

This DM Cylinder manual that only deals with the special features of the DM Cylinder. You must comply with the following steps when installing and putting the DM Cylinder into operation:

- Replace the cover on the active side with the WaveNet network cover
- Set up the DM Cylinder in LSM and programme the cylinder
- Install the DM Cylinder (see below)
- Use a PC or CommNode Server to put the network into operation locally (see FAQ entry 'WaveNet via CommNode Server: step by step' under FAQ in the Support section on the SimonsVoss website [www.simonsvoss.com]).
- Incorporate the cylinder (cylinder's LN.I) into the network; see manual on WaveNet radio network. You should pay attention to the signal strength when doing so; the level should not fall below minus 70 dBm.
- Perform functional test with an authorised ID medium

### 5.1 Prerequisites

The DM Cylinder imposes the following minimum requirements for the locking system and LSM:

- LSM 3.2 SP1 Basic, Business or Professional installed
- G2 or G2+G1 locking system
- The software LSM.Business with the modules LSM Online and LSM Network xx (128 or Enterprise) is required for an online connection (tasks and responses/events) to the DM Cylinder

The appropriate software modules and hardware components must be installed to ensure door statuses in LSM can be further processed. They define key events in the locking system and the action required. The person responsible is thus informed by email if a fire door stays open too long, for example.

- LSM Business
- LSM NETWORK xx
- LSM ONLINE
- WaveNet components (router and network covers)





#### 5.3.1 Locking devices

5.3.1.1 Cylinder

A cylinder's properties can be configured precisely, so that the door behaves exactly as you wish.

#### Prerequisites

- The LSM software needs to be open
- # At least one cylinder has been added to the locking plan
- You can see the locking plan matrix on the monitor screen

- Locking device: ID number for locking device
- Door identifier: the door name
- Location: this is where the location can be selected if one has been added
- Building: this is where the building can be selected if one has been added
- Floor: the floor on which the door is situated
- Room number: identifier for the room number
- Door code: the door ID will be generated automatically
- Description: field for additional information

- Locking devices: locking devices which are assigned to the door
- Time zone: list of the time zone plans which can be assigned to the door. This allows you to authorise certain users to use a door at certain times only
- Areas: information about the locking system, the area and the level
- Programming device: how is the locking device programmed?
  - Config device: stationary programming device, such as SmartCD
  - LockNode: network module. Flush fitted next to the door
  - WaveNet node: CentralNode or RouterNode in connection with an internal network module (LN.I). The network card is integrated into the thumb-turn cover with LN.I
- Door attributes for mortise lock: detailed information on the lock
- Door attributes for locking cylinder: detailed information on the cylinder

The 'Features' tab provides detailed information on the locking device

- Locking device: the serial number of the cylinder. The PHI number is given as standard. You can enter your own serial number as an alternative
- Door: door name
- Ordering information: item code of locking device
- Outside dimension: length of the cylinder from the fastening screw thread to the outer edge of the profile cylinder
- Inside dimension: length of the cylinder from the fastening screw thread to the inner edge of the profile cylinder
- There is more information in the table, depending on the locking device type
- Device class: specification of the locking device class
- PHI: Physical Hardware Identifier. A unique ID number for components
- Profile release: the profile version

The locking device is configured in the 'Configuration/data' tab

- You will see two sections: a target value and a current value section. The target value section allows you to configure how components should behave. The two sections will be identical once you have programmed the changes
- Pulse length: how long should the cylinder engage to open? 1-25 sec
- Access control: the cylinder logs which particular transponder is used at a particular time. The .ZK option is required
- Time zone control: certain people can open the door at specific times only. The .ZK option is required
- Logging unauthorised attempted access events: the cylinder logs when someone tries to open doors which they are not authorised to use
- Flip flop: the cylinder engages permanently until another authorisation is implemented. If flip-flop mode is selected, bolt monitoring in the DoorMonitoring Cylinder must be deactivated. The bolt position is only displayed correctly if FF mode is deactivated

- No audible battery warnings: the cylinder does not emit an audible signal when the battery needs changing
- Time switch-over function: the cylinder engages automatically/ manually at a specific time. You can set its exact behaviour under 'Extended configuration.' If the time switch-over function is selected, bolt monitoring in the DoorMonitoring Cylinder must be deactivated. The bolt position is only displayed correctly when the time switch-over function is deactivated
- Allow exceptions in time zone management (LSM Business and higher): exceptions can be configured in time zone management
- No audible programming feedback signals: the locking cylinder does not emit audible signals during the programming process
- Card interface: if a card reader is fitted to the cylinder, this is where you can activate the function.
- Extended configuration: this is where you can configure time switchover behaviour. These options are active as soon as a time zone plan has been created
  - Automatic engage: the locking device automatically engages at the pre-set time
  - Manual engage: the locking device automatically disengages at the pre-set time. The locking device automatically engages when actuated with a transponder
  - Automatic disengage: the locking device automatically disengages at the pre-set time
  - Manual disengage: the locking device remains engaged at the preset time. The locking device permanently disengages when authorised
  - Transponder always active: authorised ID media are able to continue to lock the locking device while the locking device is engaged
  - Transponder only active if disengaged: authorised ID media are not able to lock the locking device while the locking device is engaged
- Software reset: the current status is re-set in the software, to reprogramme components which have not been programmed completely, for example

#### NOTE

The monitoring configuration has a direct influence on power consumption in the cylinder.

The shorter the sampling interval is set for the fastening screw, the greater power consumption is.



### NOTE

Changes to Door Monitoring configuration do not come into effect until the cylinder has been programmed

- Sampling interval for the fastening screw: The sensor in the fastening screw scans the magnetic field at adjustable intervals. The shorter the sampling interval is set, the more complete monitoring is, but also the greater power consumption is in the cylinder. A practical compromise between effective door monitoring and efficient power consumption would be 2 to 3 seconds. The function can also be switched off if opening of the door is not to be logged. Setting: off
- Door open too long' event after: a signal is sent to LSM after the pre-set time interval.

 Number of turns to lock: Depending on the lock, the bolt is fully extended after one or a number of turns, thus locking the door securely. You can set the number of turns in these menu items.



- Logging of access list: this is where you enter whether 'Door open' and dead bolt events are to be saved to the access list

The 'Status' tab shows the last status read in the locking device

Battery status: indicates whether the batteries need to be replaced

- Emergency release: the software uses an emergency release to engage the cylinder
- Deactivated: the cylinder is deactivated. The cylinder will not engage even if an authorised transponder is used.
- Engaged: the cylinder is engaged.
- Storage mode: the batteries have discharged beyond the second warning level and the cylinder is in storage mode. This mode can be deactivated for 30 seconds using a G2 battery replacement transponder. The cylinder can then be opened with an authorised transponder during this time.

Door statuses can be transmitted via the CommNode server in the LSM software. This enables you to manage tasks and events over the network.

- LSB Business: the modules LSM Network XX, LSM CommNode and LSM Online are enabled.

## 5.3.2.2 Tasks

A task is a pre-defined job within LSM which the system is to carry out automatically. Such a task can be defined for one or more locking devices. The system can be configured in such a way that the tasks should be performed at a specific time or on a periodical basis.

These functions require that the system can be reached at all times. That is why they are only available in LSM Business with the LSM.Online module.

The tasks are set with priorities, so urgent tasks are performed first. You can determine the performance modalities (times, periods and type of task) using the menu item on the user interface. You can find more information in the 'LSM online' manual.

Two different tasks can be configured for the DM Cylinder, which are described in detail below:

#### 5.3.2.3 Events

Events in the network are linked to one or more targeted responses in Event Manager. The LSM software can trigger a pre-set response to certain events, such as an open door. Responses include a pop-up message on a computer in the network, activation of an alarm siren and an email sent to the security officer's mobile 'phone. You can enter the day of the week and time to determine the time period within which a response is to be given to an event. Special events have been created for the DoorMonitoring Cylinder. This section gives a short overview of Event Manager and events. You can find more information in the 'LSM – online' manual

# 5.4 Installation and fitting

# Installation instructions

The DM Cylinder is installed in the same way as any other SimonsVoss digital cylinder

Batteries are already installed when the product is delivered. The cylinder is ready for immediate use

When installing the digital locking cylinder, ensure that there are no sources of low-frequency interference in the surrounding area. Typical sources are:

- Switch-mode power supply units
- High-voltage power lines
- Generators
- Frequency converters

Locking cylinders should be installed at least 0.5 m from one another while SmartRelays or activation units should be 1.5 m from one another

The locking cylinder housing may only project a maximum of 3 mm from the door in outdoor areas; a profile cylinder escutcheon or fitting should be used if necessary

You must not strike the thumb-turns when installing the cylinder



## NOTE

# The DoorMonitoring Cylinder must not be fitted with conventional fastening screws

Conventional fastening screws may permanently damage the cylinder

- 1. The DM Cylinder must be fitted with a fastening screw especially manufactured for the cylinder
- 2. The fastening screw is not included in the supply package and must be ordered separately

The standard fastening screw is available for a backset between 25 mm and 110 mm at 5 mm increments. You must indicate the lock backset when you order. If you use a fastening screw which is too short, the screw will not be able to provide a firm grip; if you use one which is too long, you cannot screw it fully within the door leaf

The head of the fixing screw features a sensor. The screw is tightened using a special screwdriver or adapter. If a conventional slot screwdriver is used, it could permanently damage the screw and the sensor

Lock standards specify that the hole diameter for the fastening screw must be at least 5.4mm. Some locks are supplied with a smaller drill hole. If this is the case, you can make it larger with a 5.5-mm steel drill bit

#### Installation


There is a thumb-turn with electronics and a thumb-turn without electronics in digital locking cylinders. The thumb-turn electronics must be removed for installation. The electronics thumb-turn is on the inside for almost all cylinders. The few exceptions are:

E Comfort Cylinder: .CO

Swiss Round Cylinder: .SR

The word 'IN' is engraved on the cylinder body on inside of the cylinder

The thumb-turn without electronics is merely attached in position when delivered and can be easily removed



- 1. Outside thumb-turn (without electronics)
- 2. Locking disc with opening
- 3. Installation and battery key
- 4. Installation key (not for battery replacement)
- 5. Side marking
- 6. Recessed grip ring
- 7. Inside thumb-turn (with electronics)
- 1. Remove the thumb-turn without electronics
- 2. Insert the cylinder through the lock



3. Fasten the cylinder with the appropriate fastening screw. Do not fasten screw tightly. Use the correct screwdriver only

# NOTE

If you tighten the fastening screw too firmly, this may cause the locking cylinder to malfunction in the lock (e.g. it may jam).

Tighten the fastening screw firmly by hand (max. 3.5 Nm)

Do not use a battery-operated screwdriver



## NOTE

A conventional screwdriver can damage the sensor in the fastening screw

Tighten the fastening screw with the appropriate screwdriver only

- 4. Replace the thumb-turn and rotate until the thumb-turn grips into the indents in the flange
- 5. Place the installation key on the outer thumb-turn in such a way that the two teeth lock into the outer thumb-turn; if necessary, turn the thumb-turn until both teeth engage into the locking disc
- 6. Lock the thumb-turn into position again by rotating it 30° in a clockwise direction

## 5.4.1 Magnet installation

The sensor in the fastening screw works magnetically. Therefore you have to glue the magnetic plates, which are attached to the fastening screw, into the door frame. Then perform a function test.

One or more magnetic plates need to be glued on, depending on the door and frame material and the gap width



# NOTE

## Overdrive of the sensor

If you mount too many plates, the magnetic field becomes too strong. The sensor in the fastening screw is then overridden and no longer responds.



# NOTE

## Lack of adhesive strength due to unsuitable support surface

Dust, dirt and grease reduce the adhesive strength of the magnetic plate. The magnetic plate may fall down and cause malfunction.

- Make sure that the surface is clean and free of grease before applying magnetic plates.
- 1. Glue the magnetic plates loosely into the door frame so that the plates are opposite the head of the fastening screw.
- 2. Close the door carefully so that the latch almost clicks into place.
- 3. If the display in the LSM jumps from "open" to "closed" when the door is almost closed:
  - Reduce the number of magnetic plates.
  - Move the plate further in the direction of the centre of the frame.
  - Reduce the size of the plate.
- 4. Close the door.
  - ➡ The indicator in LSM must change from 'open' to 'closed.' If this not the case, the magnetic field is too weak for the sensor. Stick an additional plate on the door frame and repeat the test.

# 5.4.2 Functions test

The functions test verifies that the complete communication chain from the sensors to LSM function correctly

The following tests need to be performed

- ✓ The locking plan is open
- The DM cylinder is incorporated into the SimonsVoss network (WaveNet)
- The DoorMonitoring status is displayed in the locking plan
   or -
- ✓ The properties in the cylinder 'Door monitoring status' tab are open
- ✓ The individual test results can be checked in LSM
- 1. Opening the door
- 2. Closing the door
- 3. Rotate the cam bit once » lock. Repeat until the bolt is fully extended, depending on the number of turns required in the lock
- 4. Rotate the cam bit once » open. Repeat until the bolt is fully withdrawn, depending on the number of turns required in the lock
- 5. Opening the door
- 6. Leave the door open until the 'Door open too long' message appears

#### Calibration tool

This offline cylinder test is carried out with a separate calibration tool if the DoorMonitoring cylinder is set up or operated offline or the test is part of an error search if statuses are incorrectly displayed or are not displayed at all during an online test.

We recommend the calibration tool if

- The DoorMonitoring Cylinder is not networked. In such a case, you can check status changes with the tool
- The DoorMonitoring Cylinder is being set up by one person. In such a case, status changes cannot be checked directly in LSM
- The functioning of the DoorMonitoring Cylinder is to be checked for error diagnosis

The calibration tool is installed on an external portable computer and connected to LSM Mobile. A programming device connected to the computer is required

#### Installing the calibration tool

Install the calibration tool on a portable computer, so that the cylinder can be checked on the door

Insert the LSM software CD and launch the installation routine (DMCalibrate\_3\_x\_xx.exe)

Follow the instructions in the installation wizard

#### Calibration tasks

There are seven designated steps for calibration

A traffic-light-style indicator displays the status in addition to the individual step:

- Yellow: step not yet implemented
- Green: step complete and positive feedback
- Red: indicates an error. Either the step has not been followed or an error has been detected



# NOTE

Note on anti-panic cylinder: There is no monitoring of bolt movement in the DM.AP2 Cylinder. This is why you need to carry out Steps 1 to 4 when checking the DM.AP2 Cylinder. You can skip the other steps. Press [OK & Next] and ignore comments.

#### Check magnet position

If the door has been closed, but the calibration tool does not recognise that the door is closed (Step 3), the position of the magnetic plate needs to be checked or the number of magnetic plates needs to be increased.

Step 4 should also be performed on the door while ajar. If the door is identified as closed when it is ajar after Step 4, the magnetic field is too strong.

Move the plate further towards the centre of the frame or make the plate smaller

## 5.4.3 Use in escape doors

#### Use in an escape door lock

Panic locks can be unlocked and opened from the inside by pushing the door handle. The lock unlocks without the cam rotating. Some locks require an anti-panic cylinder since the cam can cause the lock to jam when in certain positions. You need to clarify with the lock manufacturer whether an AP cylinder must be used or not. Different issues need to be clarified in advance when the DM Cylinder is used in escape door locks:

- SLP lock or non-SLP lock
- Use of an AP cylinder required to prevent the lock from jamming
- Typical usage behaviour of the door.

Is the door normally opened with an authorised transponder or by pressing the inside handle? The DM Cylinder records the cam's movements and detects the lock status based on rotations and the direction of rotation. It does not record retraction of the bolt and, consequently, does not register the unlocking of the door either. Cam monitoring is deactivated in the DM.AP2 Cylinder. Manual locking is not monitored.



## NOTE

You must comply with the requirements in DIN EN 179 or EN 1125 when fitting an escape door lock.

#### Use in an SLP lock

An SLP (self-locking panic) lock can be opened on the inside by pressing the door fitting and locked when the door is closed. This means that the DM Cylinder does not reliably indicate the bolt position (at all). The DM.AP2 does not monitor the bolt position. This means that only the door's opening status can be monitored. The following setting should be configured.

Since an open door will not emit an alarm, an event needs to be generated when the door is opened. The event becomes active and a pre-defined action is implemented as soon as the door is opened.

# 6. Day-to-day operation

# 6.1 Displays

You can display the key information about your locking system directly in the locking plan. The DM Cylinder's door statuses can be shown directly on the locking plan

- This view is only useful if the DM Cylinder is connected online
- If a wireless node (LockNode) fails, the system does not detect the fault until the cylinder is addressed by the LSM (reading, reprogramming). That is why it is sensible to check the status of the WaveNet network
- The cylinders transmit all status changes to LSM (LSM Basic Online) or the CommNode server (Business / Professional) in real time. If LSM is closed, the status displayed at that moment is saved
- If a door status changes while LSM is closed (Basic) or the CommNode server has been paused (Business / Professional), the system does not record this change. The correct status is not displayed until a change has been made to the status at the door

## 7.2 Batteries

## Battery life

The battery life depends on the DM Cylinder configuration settings and the use behaviour. The following affect the battery life:

- **#** The fastening screw sampling interval
- Number of activations
- Reading the access list

- Changes to programming
- Number of tasks

The number of activations totals up to 50,000. The battery life depends on the fastening screw setting:

The battery life indicated serves as a guide. A battery warning is not emitted when the aforementioned service life expires, but is based on the measured battery capacity instead.

## NOTE

The cylinder's monitoring function is deactivated from Warning Level 2. Changes to the cylinder status are not logged or transmitted.

Once Warning Level 2 has been emitted for the first time, the door can be opened with a transponder around 50 times. After reaching this number of opening operations or after about 4 weeks, the cylinder automatically switches to freeze mode. In freeze mode, the cylinder can only be replaced using a battery replacement transponder in conjunction with an authorised transponder.

### Freeze mode

The locking device switches to freeze mode if Battery Warning Levels 1 and 2 have not been observed or the locking system administrator has not been informed of the battery warning. User transponders can no longer activate the locking device to prevent the battery from being fully discharged in this status.



## NOTE

A door can only be opened with a battery replacement transponder once in freeze mode.

Normal transponders can no longer open a door

E Replace the batteries immediately after the first warning level starts

#### **Battery replacement**

- ✓ You have a battery replacement key
- You have a battery replacement transponder
- You have new battery replacement batteries
- ✓ You have an authorised transponder
- 1. If the cylinder is in freeze mode, activate the battery replacement transponder
  - → The cylinder can now be opened with an authorised transponder
- 2. Activate the authorised transponder
- 3. Replace the batteries
- 4. Activate the battery replacement transponder
- → Freeze mode is permanently eliminated. The cylinder can be operated as normal

#### **Replacing batteries**

- Place the installation/battery key on the inside thumb-turn in such a way that the two teeth lock into the openings in the locking disc; if necessary, turn the thumb-turn until both teeth engage into the locking disc. Important: The tool must be placed flat on the inside front surface of the recessed grip ring to ensure that the installation tool can engage into the locking disc. Use clean gloves free of fat or grease to handle new batteries.
- 2. Hold the inside thumb-turn firmly and carefully turn the installation/ battery key about 30° in a clockwise direction until you hear a click.
- 3. Remove installation/battery key from the thumb-turn
- 4. Push recessed grip ring backwards towards the door, so that it comes away from the thumb-turn

- 5. Hold recessed grip ring firmly and turn thumb-turn about 10° in an anticlockwise direction and remove
- 6. Carefully remove both batteries from the holder
- 7. Insert the new batteries into the holder at the same time with the positive poles next to each other; change the batteries as quickly as possible

## NOTE

Always insert button cells with the positive poles next to each other

The batteries will only offer their full service life if they are installed correctly




## NOTE

Batteries will corrode if they come into contact with sweat or grease

Batteries will lose their capacity before time

Corroded batteries may permanently damage the cylinder

- 1. Never touch batteries with your bare hands
- 2. You must wear clean gloves free of fat or grease to handle new batteries



- 8. Replace the thumb-turn (align the triangle mark as in the diagram[4]), hold the recessed grip firmly (see diagram) and fasten the inside thumb-turn by turning in a clockwise direction about 10°
- 9. Push recessed grip ring back onto the thumb-turn, so that the thumbturn and ring close together in a flush fit
- 10. Place the installation/battery key on the inside thumb-turn in such a way that the two teeth lock into the openings in the locking disc; if necessary, turn the thumb-turn until both teeth engage into the locking disc

- 11. Close the thumb-turn again by turning it about 30° in a clockwise direction until you hear a click
- 12. Then activate an authorised transponder and check that it functions

## Forward events

If the door statuses are not displayed in LSM, check the network configuration.

First, determine the locking device's network detection

- The 'Network' column is shown in the locking plan. The 'W' is visible in the locking plan
- 1. Position the mouse cursor on the 'W' in the locking plan > The WaveNet node number is displayed, e.g. WNNode\_0026
- 2. Note down the identifier for later use

#### Activate input events

The input events must be activated, so that events can be transmitted from the cylinder to the LockNode

- 1. Open the menu item 'Network' > 'Collective tasks' > 'WaveNet nodes'
- 2. Highlight the node which features the number that you wrote down earlier
- 3. Click on [Activate input events]

- 2. Select the network segment with the required WaveNet node
- 3. Highlight the door 'Nodes/addresses'
- 4. Click on [Properties]

- 6. Click on [Programme]
- 7. Close the window

#### Fastening screw

The DM Cylinder requires a special fastening screw with an integrated door opening sensor.

Order code: Z4.DM.xx.SCREW.n

Fastening screw xx indicates the locking device's backset and should not be confused with the fastening screw length. Standard fastening screws are supplied for backsets between 25 and 70mm at increments of 5 mm. Special lengths available on request.

### Screwdriver

The screw head on the fastening screw rises in the middle, so that the fastening screw cannot be fastened with a normal slot screwdriver. A screwdriver is available as a tool.
